## Kindergarten Registration

Registration forms for the 2018 - 2019 school year are available on the Board website: www.yrdsb.ca. Children born 2013 or 2014, live in the school boundary and whose parents/guardians are public school tax supporters are eligible for kindergarten.

All documentation must be completed before your child can be enrolled. Original documents required for registration include:

- Proof of child's age (birth certificate, passport, statement of birth)
- Proof of residency of the student
  - Two documents, one from A. and one from B.:
  - A. (e.g. tax assessment notice, current rental or lease agreement, purchase agreement, property tax bill) AND
  - B. (e.g. utility bill, bank statement or other official document)
- Citizenship and immigration status (if applicable)
- Legal , Custody, Adoption (if applicable)
- Direction of school support form (school office)

Current JK students do not need to register for SK as they are already enrolled.

## **September School Bus Transportation Notice**

Each summer, Student Transportation Services of York Region makes adjustments to bus route schedules to accommodate new students and new school openings. As a result, some students experience changes in their bus schedule or route number. Please confirm bus stop service by checking <u>www.schoolbuscity.com</u> If you are unable to find the information you require, please contact your school.

During the first two weeks of school, students should arrive at their bus stop *ten minutes early*. After this, students are asked to arrive 5 minutes early, as each bus route develops its regular routine and service times.

## Transportation Eligibility

In accordance with Board policies, transportation is provided for students who live within their designated Home School attendance area and outside their grade appropriate Non-Transportation Zone. Transportation eligibility changes throughout a student's school career. Please note students currently in Grade 3 and Grade 8 who use school bus service will see a change in their eligibility as they transition to Grade 4 and Grade 9.

### Eligibility JK - Grade 8

• All students in Grades JK-3 who live within 1.2 km of their school are not eligible for transportation

- All students in Grades 4-8 who live within 1.6 km of their school are not eligible for transportation
- All students in Grades 9-12 who live within a transit served area are not eligible for transportation.

## **Tips For Families**

Consider the following helpful tips when preparing for your child to ride the bus.

- Often parents want to drive children to school on the first day. Student Transportation Services recommends that if you drive your children to school the first day, you also pick them up
- Communicate any changes to daycare locations to your child's school prior to the start of the school year to ensure your child is placed on the correct bus
- JK, SK and Grade 1 students must be met at the bus stop by a parent/guardian
- Keep current phone and emergency contact numbers up to date with the school office.
- Record the bus company and route # for your child and keep it in a safe and accessible place.
- Have an alternative arrangement for your child should unexpected circumstances such as traffic delay or any other emergency occurs.
