Mrs. Candice Schlosser introduced herself, sharing that she has been a Teacher since 2001, and an Administrator since 2012, has 2 YRDSB children. - 5. In person classroom teachers have been advised to be up to date with Google Classroom in the event of school closures leading to virtual learning. Next opportunity to change from in-person to virtual learning and vice versa will be at the end of Term 1 (end of January 2021).
- 6. Parents/Guardians are reminded to screen their children for COVID-19 symptoms before sending them school.
- 7. Students with symptoms can return to school once parents/guardians confirm that the COVID-19 test is negative. If positive, then student can return after 14 days. Parents/Guardians of cohort class are notified. Same rules apply to teachers/staff. School gets advice from Public Health/School Nurse and the Board. Students who miss school can reach out to their teacher to receive schoolwork thru Google Classroom while at home.
- 8. Daily cleaning schedule being implemented: high touch areas (ie: railings, doorknobs) are being cleaned twice a day. Alcohol wipes used for all technology equipment even though every student has their own computer. No upgrades to school building ventilation system. Students are required to bring their own masks. Masks available in office, in case of an emergency. Staff use Board approved masks. Kindergarten teachers wear masks and face shields. Staff will also wear PPE equipment when working with students who need extra support or individuals sent to the isolation room when showing symptoms of COVID-19. Physical distancing still an issue among intermediate students. Challenging for Staff. An email will be sent to all families about this. Virtual
