• Welcome and thank you for coming out for our first parent council meeting of 2015 – 2016 school year

2. Principal's Report – Sheri Epstein:

- Has been a great start
- Working on getting timetables fixed all kids get face time to discuss the changes and what is/isn't possible targeting completion for this Friday
- We are 130 kids over (1,255) what board originally predicted
- Second semester changes will be focused on next week
- We received additional staffing at end of August
- Still short two teachers and hope to have the positions filled shortly
- Kids (particularly senior grades) have little impact as most of time now is review and teachers are used to these changes in the first few weeks
- Q: Is it possible to sort this out before school starts? A: No, not practical as sections not finalized, kid's take programs in summer which impacts what they then can/do take in the year
- Q: Can kids pick next year's courses later in the year? A: February deadlines set by board

- Doing safety assemblies for all grades (school protocols, policies, safe schools); Grade 9 were done during orientation
- Tomorrow is picture day (grade 9 period 1, grade 10 period 2, grade 11 period 3, grade 12 period 4/5) in the gym

- First fire drill (6x), hold and secure (2x) and lock down drill (2x) coming up

- Have had a great time coming back to school
- Great registration effort
- Grade 9 day went very well with the kick off with the 'Wolf Pack' program which pairs up a grade 12 student with 10 grade 9 students
- Lots of parents attended
- Coming up... annual club fair (new/old clubs) in the atrium (over 20 clubs registered and new being added); interest clubs
- Elections for grade 9 representatives plus two for grade 12 coming up for student council coming up in next few weeks
- Lots in the works with the new council
- Tomorrow all the Wolf Pack leaders and council going on a training retreat (green acres) to better support grade 9 trip coming up in October

5. Guidance Report – Rod Conte

- University fair is at The Metro Toronto Convention Center (Sep 25-27); not too early to go in grade 10 (window shopping); lots of choices (including colleges)
- We have a University fair on November 4 at Alexander Mackenzie HS (evening)
- Take your kids to work day is November 4
- To graduate, kids seed 6 UM courses (English must be one); maths/science optional depending on what program they apply for
- Others are university fairs are available throughout York region
- At end of November, grade 12 students get PINs to log into OUAC to begin the university application process
- No PIN required for college (<u>www.ontariocolleges.ca</u>)
- October 12 will have a grade 12 assembly to review all of the details on what grade 12 graduation requirements are; will be posted on guidance website as well for parents
- College fair October 19/20 DirectEnergy Center at CNE
- Get a Twitter account to follow @WCIGuidance updates/info in realtime, anytime!
- Get application setup and done before Christmas break; can be changed prior to deadline





- Early acceptance is not something you apply to, Universities will do this themselves if deemed 'worthy'... don't get caught up on this!
- Grade 12 marks are critical; scholarships are offered on grade 12 marks only
- Timetable changes going well get them what they need first, then what they want second; working to finish by this Friday
- Expectation is that you are a full time student (minimum 6 courses in grade 12); there will be NO part time students (no exceptions)
- Semester two changes don't have to deal with this now. Want to focus on semester one; grade 9/10 timetable changes must be completed by Dec 15; grade 11/12 can do changes can be done after the semester starts

- It is OK for students to close doors on programs they don't want to focus on what your strengths are

- June 29 is Graduation

8. New Business – All

- Q: Do you have to register in a club now, or are they open? A: No limit, however some clubs (like DECA) need you to register now, others are open to join at any time
- Q: What is the advantage of doing summer school to get ahead? A: Lots of kids do this to get ahead; not easier to get one as one week of normal school is done in a day at summer school; be careful what subjects you do (i.e. electives are a good focus); consult with guidance for help during course selection
- Speaker: YouthSpeak which speak to social stresses, anxiety and other elements that kids deal with; done for kids and then in the evening for parents young adults who speak to their peers; struggled with some element of mental health; what were the triggers, supports to help them deal with it and get through it
