What type of online courses are eligible to meet this requirement?

Asynchronous (not live).

All online learning credits earned at a school authorized to offer credits towards an Ontario Secondary School Diploma may count towards the graduation requirement.

What to Consider

- **Compulsory Courses**
 - English, Math
 - C → College (NBE3C1, MBF3C1)

 - M → College/University (MCF3M1)
 U → University (NBE3U, MCR3U1)
- Select 8 courses for Grade 11.
- ALL students must have a **FULL** TIMETABLE.
 - 4 courses each Semester
 - You are able to select a Grade 12 course in your selection as long as you will have the prerequisite.
 - Speak to the teachers who teach the courses you're interested in.





Other Considerations

- Group 1, 2, & 3 Compulsory Courses.
 - Dropping science after Grade 10?
 - Consider Group 3 (Tech, Co-op, a third French).
- Community Involvement Hours.
- Elective Prerequisites Thinking Ahead Plan Backwards
 - Check Grade 12 courses to see if there is a Grade 11 prerequisite (Tech, Computer Science/Tech, Arts, languages, Accounting)
 - For Example: TDJ4M1 (Design Tech) requires TDJ3M1.
- Have you done an Arts (art, dance, drama, music) credit?

Other Considerations

- Select Grade 11 courses you plan to complete at Westmount.
- Do not select any course you intend to <u>complete</u>
 outside WCI (See
 Guidance).





Co-operative Education

- Gain work experience in a field of interest while earning high school credits.
- You can select 2 or 4 credits.
 - 2 credits: Periods 1&2 or 4&5.
 - 4 credits: Full day.
- Speak with Ms. Del-Bianco if you are interested in OYAP or Accelerated OYAP.
- Application required.
 - Select Co-op on myBlueprint then complete the online application which can be found on your myBlueprint.






Dual Credit






