What type of online courses are eligible to meet this requirement?

Asynchronous (not live). All Online Learning credits earned at a school authorized to offer credits towards an Ontario Secondary School Diploma may count towards the graduation requirement.

May a student count credits earned during remote learning in 2020-2021?

In recognition of the extraordinary circumstances of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Ministry of Education has stated that **one** secondary school credit successfully completed by **Grade 9 students during the province-wide school closure (April to June 2021)** may be counted towards the Online Learning graduation requirement.

What online learning courses are available to meet this requirement?

Online Learning courses offered through your day school and Online Learning summer school courses meet this requirement.



Five Compulsory Courses:

- English, Math, Science, History, Civics/Careers (CIVCAR)
- History and Math offered at the Academic level only for Grade 10
- English and Science offered at the Applied & Academic level
- CIVCAR offered as an Open course

Three Elective Courses:

- Can be completely different from grade 9 electives
- Have you done an Arts (visual art, dance, drama, music) and Phys. Ed. credit?

Choosing for Grade 11 - What to Consider

• Compulsory Courses:

English, Math

- E = Workplace (MEL3E)
- C = College (NBE3C1, MBF3C1)
- M = College/University (MCF3M1)
- U = University (NBE3U1, MCR3U1)
- Elective Prerequisites Thinking Ahead Plan Backward

Check Gr. 12 Courses to see if there is a Gr. 11 Prerequisite

For Example: TDJ4M1 (Design Tech) requires TDJ3M1

Choosing for Grade 12 - What to Consider

Will you meet all graduation requirements?

30 credits, 40 hours, literacy test, 2 online credits/opt out = OSSD

At this stage, it is not about leaving doors open.

It is about taking courses required for post secondary programs - do your research

It is about taking courses you do well in

What is your post-secondary pathway destination?

- Workplace: OSSD
- Apprenticeship: OSSD + requirements (which vary). Consider OYAP.
- College: ENG4C or ENG4U + combo of Gr. 11 & 12 C, M or U courses
- University: ENG4U + 5 M or U courses = 6 courses (check prereq's)

Choosing for Grade 12 Grade 12 - FULL TIME Status

- We want to have full time students at WCI. In Grade 12, students must have a minimum of 3 courses each semester. Courses taken outside of Westmount are not included in this count.
- After mid-term report cards are handed out, students may request to drop a course and take a minimum of 2 courses for the remainder of the semester.
 - 1 course is never allowed
 - Only courses you have been attending regularly will be approved to drop

- Do not select a compulsory course if you're taking it in summer school or elsewhere. There is a video in the Public Folder that demonstrates how to change a compulsory course to a different elective.

• Number of Required Courses Per Year:

Grade 9 - 8 courses Grade 10 - 8 courses Grade 11 - 8 courses

*2 alternates are always required for every student

Grade 12 - 6 courses. We recommend selecting 7 courses.

The Importance of Course Selection

- Students will be choosing courses once this year. This means once you submit, there are no changes.
- Take your time, do your research, ask questions - Be 100% satisfied with your choices now.
- The timetable for all grades will be built on your course selections in February.

 Students are selecting courses that they would like to take at WCI - Selection does not guarantee placement in a course on your timetable.

• Alternate courses are important.

Be accurate and intentional with your choices.

Grade 10s can pick Grade 11 courses in February. Grade 11s can pick Grade 12 courses in February.

**Note*: A grade 10/11 student may be removed from an upper grade course.

**Note*: After the February deadline, students cannot request an upper grade course until all students in that grade have been placed in their required courses. • How are the number of sections per course allocated?

An example:

134 kids sign up for English - we run 5 sections 134 kids sign up for Law - we run 4 sections *Compulsory courses vs. elective courses*

SPECIALIZED PROGRAMS

Co-operative Education

- Grade 11 or Grade 12 students
- Gain work experience in a field of interest while earning high school credits.
- Examples of placements include: radio stations, hospitals, vet clinics, schools, law offices, graphic design, computer science and engineering, business, apprenticeships, real estate, physio, architecture.
- Select 2 or 4 credits
- Application required:
 - Select Co-op on myBlueprint then complete the <u>ON-LINE</u>
 <u>APPLICATION</u> which can be found in myBlueprint
 - Ms. Del-Bianco will connect with you in the spring to talk about your interests and possible placements

OYAP (Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program)

- Opens the door for students to explore and gain training in apprenticeship occupations starting in Grade 11 or Grade 12 through the Cooperative Education program.
- There are over 150 skilled trades to choose from in 4 main categories Construction, Industrial, Motive Power, Service.
- It's estimated that by 2025, 40% of all occupations will be in skilled trades
- Students have an opportunity to become registered apprentices and work towards becoming certified in a skilled trade while completing their secondary school diplomas.
- OYAP is a smart choice if you wish to jump-start your career. Jobs in the skilled trades can pay well and challenge your intellect and creativity.

Specialist High Skills Major (SHSM)

• S.H.S.M is a bundle of courses, certifications that allow students to experience a range of career-focused educational learning opportunities.
