OECA WESTMOUNT 2017 - 2018

DECA provides the perfect opportunity to introduce students into the world of business. Through weekly Wednesday meetings and training, leading to a regional business competition, students will be exposed to real life applications of issues within businesses, and will learn how to address these concerns in a professional manner. Through role-play of case studies and preparation of written reports, the student will learn to quickly problem solve, using business logic and strategies. They will then present a solution to their provided situation to a judge. They will be given the opportunity to compete against the region, onto province and possibly world, if they are successful in progressing from the regional competition.

DECA allows students to build on their business knowledge, create professional partnerships and develop confidence, employability skills and demonstrate leadership, which can be applied in every day life. 92% of DECA members say that they learned to communicate thoughts and ideas, as well as what businesses expect from employees while gaining problem solving skills. As well, 90% of members say that their experience empowered them to be an effective leader and affected their contributions to the community and daily lives. Past members of DECA also say that their experience had prepared them academically for post secondary school, influenced their post-secondary plans, career paths, and their interest in business.

If a student is interested in the DECA program and would like to learn more about it, a meeting will be held on **Wednesday September 13, 2017** after school in the cafeteria.


