Message from the Admin Team

Welcome back to 2018

The staff of Westmount hopes that you had a relaxing winter break and had plenty of time for friends and family. Though we've been back for just over a week, it's been busy here, and will only get busier as the semester winds down.

Last week, the Westmount Drama Department presented a truncated run of "The Farm Show", a collective drama piece set in 1970s south-western Ontario. A cast of colourful characters detailed the average experiences found in rural communities in an entertaining and light-hearted way. The students were absolutely incredible, as they portrayed their various roles with warmth, humour and understanding. Whether engaging in country line-dancing, woefully recalling a farming accident or remembering the struggle of the bailer and the maw, students excelled in every aspect of their performance. And who could ever forget a rap battle between two farming tractors (Go Team John Deer!)? All students should be very proud of their efforts, and a special acknowledgement to the creative genius behind this semester's show, Mr. Dolha. Congratulations to all on a very successful run.

Looking ahead, the WCI Dance students will be performing their end-of-semester show, this Tuesday and Wednesday evenings at the Vaughan City Playhouse. Having had the opportunity to sneak into rehearsals prior to the break, I'm confident when I tell you that the show will be absolutely amazing. The students energy, especially in their "jazzercise" number, will be infectious.

As you have probably heard by now, Friday was one those days here at Westmount. The Board declared an Inclement Weather Day, cancelling all bussing for the day. As a result of the Board's decision at 6:00 a.m., any assessments (tests/assignments/presentations) were automatically postponed. This is the same procedure that is in place, should an Inclement Weather Day be declared during our upcoming Exam Writing Period. While we understand that it can be disappointing to students to have assignments postponed, we thank you for your understanding. During an Inclement Weather Day, unless explicitly mentioned, schools will remain open and academic programming will continue. However, please note, that academic programming may differ from the programming on a regular day, depending on teacher availability and other factors.

In addition to the Inclement Weather Day declaration on Friday, we also experienced a partial power outage between 8:30 and 11:00 a.m., and then a full power outage from 11:00 a.m. onwards. Even in face of these obstacles, we thank teachers and students for their flexibility during the day. The power was only eventually restored after 7:00 p.m. on Friday night, as a result of longer-than-expected repairs. We are proud of the fact that the we were able to keep the school open and the students safe.

Our exams begin on January 25th and continue through until January 31st. Students are able to access the most up-to-date exam schedule via the link on the main page of TeachAssist. All exams during the exam period begin promptly at 10:00 a.m. If, on the morning of your child's exam, they are unable to write, please contact the school's Main Office (905) 882-0277 and speak to either of the Vice Principals to learn about next steps. If you are already aware of an issue that would prevent your child from writing their exam during their block, please contact Mr. Taylor (todd.taylor@yrdsb.ca) to discuss alternatives. It is the expectation of teaching staff and administration that all students will complete their final exams. Requests to be excused for vacations cannot be entertained.

In the event that an Inclement Weather Day is called on an Exam Day, that exam will be post-poned until **Thursday**, **February 1**st **at 10:00 a.m.** This will have a knock-on effect on Exam Review Day and the start-up of Semester 2. More information will be communicated with you, via email, should this be the case.

At this time in the semester, many students can feel overwhelmed and stressed out. As a parent, helping your child organize their time, reviewing effective study strategies and ensuring that your child eats well, gets enough sleep and finds time both for physical activity and entertainment are some of the best things you can do. The WCI Library will be open from 9:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. every day of the Exam Block for students to engage in quiet study. Additionally, to support students' well-being during the exam period, our Phys Ed Department is activities to help students deal with stress. More information is available later in the newsletter.

With the end of Semester 1 rapidly approaching, thoughts turn to Semester 2. Students will be able to access their Semester 2 Timetables exclusively via TeachAssist, on the morning of February 5th. Guidance has been dealing with course changes for the past couple of weeks and all students should be aware that classes and teachers may change from what they originally were scheduled into earlier in the school year. These changes may have been requested, but also may be as a result of other structural changes.

And finally, thinking of September already, Mr. Conte and the Guidance Department hosted their Course Selection Assemblies for students in Grade 9, 10 and 11 last week. Students must select their courses for the 2018 – 2019 School Year, between January 22nd and February 23rd. Of special note, students in Grade 11 this year should consult <u>E-Info Ontario</u> or <u>Ontario Colleges</u> to ensure that they will have the required prerequisites for admission, if they are applying to post-secondary educational opportunities. Should you child have any questions or concerns, it is best that they make an appointment with Guidance.
