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Town Hall Q & A

Last Wednesday, Westmount hosted its first Town Hall for our Parents' Council, a chance for you to ask the burning questions that you've always wanted answered. Looking forward to seeing you at our next Town Hall at 7:00 p.m. on February 13th where our topic will be e-cigarettes and vaping. We'll have an Tobacco Enforcement Officer as well as a York Region Public Health nurse to explain the recent changes to the Smoke Free Ontario Act and the implications for students, as long as some of the health concerns.

SHSM

Did you know that your child could be entitled to an extra \$500 a year for enrichment activities through the SHSM Program? Designed to provide students with real world skills, the SHSM Programs at WCI offer insights and opportunities not available to students in regular programming. We have four different SHSM programs at WCI: Arts & Culture, Business, Not for Profit and Health & Wellness. As part of the SHSM programs, students must complete a Co-Op placement (normally in Grade 11), as well as a variety of other subject related courses (though they are likely taking these courses anyways). Additionally, students participate in enrichment tasks, which can be various certifications (First Aid is mandatory for all, other offerings include Leadership, Project Management and Customer Service to name a few). Students can indicate their interest in participating in SHSM in their Grade 10 year, using the button found in My Blueprints. 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OSSLT Preparation Literacy After-School Program

Do you have a child writing the OSSLT this year? One of the many supports Westmount is putting into place to support our students is to offer an After-School Literacy program. The goal of this program is to build the literacy skills of students who need additional intervention; for students to build their confidence in reading and/or writing skills; and for those students who just want to improve these skills prior to the test. The classes offer an opportunity for students to benefit from some extra help in literacy. Your child will need to attend all sessions to get the maximum benefit from this program.

The after school program consists of ten, 1.5 hour sessions. Students will attend twice a week for five weeks. There is a fee of \$102.80 for VISA students only. The program will run every Tuesday and Thursday from 3:30 pm to 5:00 pm starting Tuesday, February 12th and ending Thursday March 21st. Please note there will be no session during the March Break. A commitment from 12 students is needed for this program to be offered.

SCHOOL BUS CANCELLATION NOTICE

Please note the following;

- A decision to cancel school bus service will be **region-wide** meaning all school buses, vans and taxis will not operate. Both the YRDSB and YCDSB operate many regional educational programs.
