

We are on Indigenous Land

We affirm that we are all treaty people and acknowledge that the York Region District School Board is located on the lands of two treaties. These treaties have been signed with the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation and the First Nations of the Williams Treaties who are: the Mississaugas of Alderville, Curve Lake, Hiawatha, Scugog Island; and the Chippewas of Beausoleil, Rama, and Georgina Island who is our closest neighbour and partner in education.

To honour this agreement we will take up our responsibility to be respectful of their traditions, knowledge and inherent rights as sovereign nations. We will respect their relationship with these lands and recognize that our connection to this land is through the continued relationship with these First Nations, and we acknowledge our shared responsibility to respect and care for the land and waters for future generations.

Michaëlle Jean

Michaëlle Jean, born in Haiti in 1957, is a Canadian radio and television personality, as well as a former Governor General of Canada.

Jean was the first person of Caribbean descent to appear on French television news in Canada and played an important role in aiding postearthquake reconstruction efforts in Haiti.

She founded the Michaelle Jean Foundation, a non-profit organization aimed at inspiring and empowering at-risk youth in Canada through the arts and culture.

Know the Health Risks of Cannabis



Mental Health

Daily or near-daily use of cannabis can contribute to dependence and mental health problems over time.



Driving

Cannabis can impair your motor coordination, judgment and other skills required for safe driving.

Respiratory Effects

Toxic and carcinogenic chemicals found in tobacco smoke are also found in cannabis smoke, and can affect the lungs and airways. There will be consequences for students if they are believed to be in possession or under the influence of alcohol, illegal drugs or cannabis including edibles. Suspension will be considered.


