These treaties have been signed with the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation and the First Nations of the Williams Treaties who are: the Mississaugas of Alderville, Curve Lake, Hiawatha, Scugog Island; and the Chippewas of Beausoleil, Rama, and Georgina Island who is our closest neighbour and partner in education.

- Develop ongoing opportunities for student voice and student leadership at the school levels










- 74 (79%) I feel pressure to achieve high marks in school
- 57 (61%) I need help with test-taking strategies
- 56 (60%) I need help to manage my time and organize myself to get my school work done
- 52 (55%) I do not feel that I handle stress and anxiety well
- 40 (43%) I have body image concerns
- 38 (40%) I need help to live a healthier lifestyle (ex. Sleep hygiene, healthy eating, exercise, etc.)
- 31 I am not engaged in school life (ex. Sports teams, clubs)
- 24 I do not feel well-liked by other students in my grade
- 16 I have a negative family environment (ex. Argue with siblings, argue with parents, parents arguing, etc.)
- 6 I feel peer pressure to engage in substance abuse



 - Language Conventions (Selected-Response)




- Two student out at a time Max.
