Staffing

- Teaching staff numbers remain the same for 2018-2019
- Kindergarten enrollment is lower than projected; currently 12 JKs and 3 SKs; anticipate current class of JKs (approx. 22) to remain at WHPS for SK
- Ministry is providing additional funding for guidance and transition teachers; approximately 30 teachers to be deployed to support 160 elementary schools in the York Region District School Board
 - o Role is to support grades 7-8 with pathways and high school options, support parents with questions
 - 1 teacher would support several schools
