

Please inform the office if you **do not want your child to be photographed or videotaped** during this event.


Our students are really looking forward to this event and know it will be an incredible day of fun and learning for our students and staff.


## A BERCZY ATHLETIC UPDATE


### Student-Designed Logo Chosen for the Big Day



### Berczy Breaks Mathletes All-Time Record



On February 6th and 7th, every Berczy student from grades 2 to 6 participated in Mathletes. Mathletes is a full day of Math challenges and puzzles and on those two days and in the evening of the 7th, Berczy students and parents answered 24, 961 math questions! This was a new all-time record for Mathletes.

There were 4 activity stations in the gym. The first station was the pentominoes. In 2D pentominoes, you have a few puzzle sheets and you use some pentominoes (there are 12) to fill in the shape on the sheet. The sheet also says how many pentominoes to use. Only Grade 5 and lower use 2D pentominoes and Grade 6 and above use 3D pentominoes. 3D pentominoes are pentominoes, except 3D.

The second station is the word problems and brain teasers. These are word problems that range from really easy to harder. Some of them need to be written out while some don't need to be.

The third station is tangram puzzles. Tangrams are like pentominoes except they vary in shape and are not square/cube.




