		 Healthy Snack program Led by Ms. Sunitha Krishnan Various snacks are sourced (thank you Mrs. Krishnan!) and delivered to the school, funded by several nutrition donation programs (applied to by Principal and Vice Principal) Volunteers needed in the morning and afternoon. Morning: sort food and deliver bins to classrooms Afternoon: collect and clean bins
		 Library (book shelving) Help re-shelve and organize books in school library Great opportunity to work with the school Librarians, and to learn about books available to students Commitment: 1 day per week, a few daytime hours Limited training required (book sorting / shelving system) All required volunteer spots were filled during this meeting
		 Pizza Day There is a weekly pizza day, where slices are sold and delivered to students during lunch. Volunteers needed to order pizza (Pizza Nova) and pick + deliver slices to classrooms (e.g. ensure classes get the right number of cheese and pepperoni slices) Program runs every Friday from 12:15-12:50 p.m. 20 volunteers required each Friday, not required to commit for the full year (e.g. join us on a day-off or slow work-from-home-day)[KM1] Typically, we see lots of Moms, this year we need more Dads!
