

ADMINISTRATORS' MESSAGE

We have had a great start to the school year! September has been a busy month full of activities including the annual Terry Fox Run, which raised \$1987.65. Many clubs and teams have started including: Intermediate Volleyball, Cross Country, Lunch Monitors and Library Helpers.

Reflecting the work of our School Improvement Plan (SIP), our staff continue to work collaboratively on inquiry based learning with a particular focus in Mathematics. Each classroom has a dedicated math block during which time students are engaged in meaningful learning experiences. Teachers have also been working with students on establishing routines that support the development of appropriate structures and attitudes related to math success.

Research tells us that when parents are involved in their children's learning, students are more likely to experience success. We value the partnership between home and school and encourage parents to continue to be involved in school life. Our school results for EQAO have been reported. The following results indicate the percentage of participating students achieving at or above the provincial standards: It is important to note that the school scores provided are for All students. These scores include the students who did not participate in the assessment for various reasons (absent, Special Education or Stage One English Language Learner).

The scores for participating students (all those that participated in the assessment) are as follows: At or above Provincial Standard-Grade 3: Reading 78%, Writing 91%, and Math 67%.

Physical Conduct Expectations and Playground Expectations

In order to prevent physical injury and because of our concern for student safety, students at Wilshire E.S. are expected to avoid activities that involve aggressive play and touching. Activities that are not acceptable include wrestling, piggy-backing, tripping, pushing, shoving, body-checking, poking, punching, and other forms of play in stairwells, hallways and playgrounds. During recess breaks, students are able to play organized games such as basketball, soccer and foot hockey as well as activities such as skipping and tag.

On the playground students will play safely without the use of rough play (wrestling, piggy-backing, pushing/shoving, body-checking, tripping, play fighting) or violence.



Peanut/Nut Safe Environments

Wilshire Elementary School is a nut safe environment. We appreciate your support in working towards providing a safe environment for all of our students.

What do I do?

The most important thing you can do is to avoid sending any foods from home that may contain peanuts and/or nuts. Check the ingredient list for peanut oil, peanut butter, peanut sauce, peanut flour, peanut meal, mixed nuts, ground nuts, goober nuts, goober peas, artificial nuts and granola nuts. There are many hidden sources of peanuts/nuts in foods. Some examples include cookies, chocolate, granola bars, some cereal bars, and some vegetable oils and shortening.

Substitute Peanut Butter Products:

We encourage you to avoid the use of substitute peanut butter products. These products look, taste and smell like peanut butter and can mimic this known allergen and may cause anaphylaxis in some children. It can be confused as peanut butter, or worse yet, peanut butter could be confused as this soy-based product.

Adjustments to the Safe Welcome Program

As a result of parent and staff feedback, and working in cooperation with York Region District School Board Plant Services staff, the Safe Welcome program is being adjusted to allow more effective access to schools. These changes are:

- The school front door is **unlocked** between the time of the dismissal bell and when the main office closes (3:15—4:00).
- Access to the childcare program door is a keyed entry once the front door is locked
- An appropriate door is to be unlocked 15 minutes before a permit begins, and is to be locked
 15 minutes after the permit begins.

The Safe Welcome Program will continue to be monitored to ensure the safety of everyone.
