

In addition to communicating with the public, we are also responsible for:

Establishing a Multi-Year Strategic Plan. This <u>plan</u> sets out our priorities as a school board and guides our direction and decision making as a system.

Setting policy. <u>Policies</u> govern the operation of our schools and organization, including field trips, school transportation, homework, caring and safe schools and much more. You can find out which policies are up for review in our <u>meeting agendas</u>, or which <u>policies are out for comment</u> on the website. Your participation in this process is important to ensuring our policies are serving our communities and align with our priorities.

Setting an annual budget. I look forward to sharing more information about this process with you in the coming months as we engage in <u>budget</u> consultations.

Participating on Board and Advisory Committees. You can find the dates and agendas for these meetings on the Board website. You are welcome to attend nd observe any <u>public Board</u>. Advisory and Board Committee meetings.

Hiring the Director of Education. This process is governed by the <u>Director of</u> <u>Education Selection Policy</u>, and we will keep you updated as this process progresses. In the meantime, I am deeply grateful to Interim Director of Education Scott Yake for his commitment and service. **Advocating for guality public education**. I became a school board trustee

because I believe in public education. I believe in the potential of each and every one of our students and our responsibility to nurture their learning, growth and achievement. Our decisions as a board are centred on our commitment to deliver the best for our students.		
What's Happening in YRDSB Kindergarten registration opened January 20 for families with children who will start Kindergarten in September 2023. French Immersion registration is open from January 20-February 6 for students entering Grade 1 in September 2023. Student trustee elections are currently underway. All students in Grades 5-12 will have an opportunity to vote for the student trustees who will represent them next school year.		
In February, we recognize Black History Month, celebrating the contributions of Black people to the fabric of our society. Inclusive School and Community Services Federal Housing Benefit for Renters Who Qualify The Federal Government has introduced a one-time, \$500 tax-free benefit. • It is for low-income renters who: • Have an Adjusted Family Net Income (AFNI) for 2021 of 35,000 or less for families, or \$20,000 reless for individuals. • Spent at least 30% of their adjusted family net income on renting their opiniopal residence in Canada in 2022		
This is a one-time benefit administered by the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA). • To be eligible you do not need to already be receiving other housing benefits • Applications are open until Friday March 31, 2023.
