

Hinduism is the world's oldest religion, according to many scholars, with roots and customs dating back more than 4,000 years. Today, with about 900 million followers, Hinduism is the third-largest religion behind Christianity and Islam. Roughly 95 percent of the world's Hindus live in India. Because the religion has no specific founder, it's difficult to trace its origins and history. Hinduism is unique in that it's not a single religion but a compilation of many traditions and philosophies. More Bay 2016, the province of Ontario designated November as Hindu Heritage Month Act. Hindus first arrived in Canada at the beginning of the 20th century. During various waves of immigration, Hindus from all parts of the world continued to make Canada their home from the 1960s to present day. There are many Hindus who have settled in the Greater Toronto Area, including York Region. "By proclaiming the month of November as Hindu Heritage Month, the Province of Ontario ecognizes the important contributions that Hindu Canadians have made to Ontario's social, economic, political and cultural fabric.Hindu " Heritage Month Act, 2016

Monday, November 7th. Whose Land Interactive Treaty Locator Tool	Many Canadians believe that treaties are a thing of the past. They think that all treaties were negotiated before Canada became a country and that they are no longer a part of the way that the Canadian Government engages with Indigenous nations. Not only are treaties still being made today in the form of comprehensive land claims, treaties made in the past remain legally-binding agreements between nations that must be adhered to by all settlers residing in this country. The phrase, "we are all treaty people" is an effective way of expressing the legal obligations that all Canadians have to uphold the terms of the treaties. And in order to ensure that they are not breaking the contract, Canadians must educate themselves about the obligations and responsibilities they have to Indigenous nations and to the land.
