We look forward to welcoming back all of our Windham Ridge PS students and families on Wednesday, September 7, 2022.



Entry procedures have been modified for the first day of school.

• Students in grades 2-8:

- All families will receive an email on Tuesday, September 6 with information about your child's classroom teacher and room number.
 Please help your child with this information so that they can locate their classroom.
- Students in grades 2-8 are welcome to enter the building at 8:25am.
 Staff will be available in the school hallways with class lists to support students in finding their classroom.

Grades 1 students:

 Grade 1 students will meet their teachers at the back of the school adjacent to the tarmac- please see map above. Staff will be available to assist students to their teachers. We ask that parents/guardians wait behind the indicated areas on the map. In the event of rain, grade 1 students will meet inside the gym.

Beginning on Thursday, September 8th, grades 1-8 will line up each morning on the tarmac and will enter the school at 8:40am.

We appreciate that the first day of school is a memorable moment for families. If you are interested in capturing this moment with photos and/or videos, we ask that you take images of your child(ren) individually and refrain from taking photos/videos that include other students. Thank you in advance for supporting privacy considerations for all members of our school community.

Dismissal

Students in grades 2-8 will be dismissed at 3:10 pm from the northeast and northwest doors. **Please wait behind the indicated areas** above if you will be picking up your child. Grade 1 students will be dismissed from the southeast doors to a parent/guardian by our staff.



Bus information:

Please go to www.schoolbuscity.com to find out if your child is eligible for the bus. The website will provide you with the bus number (Route ID), bus stop location and the time for the morning and afterschool bus. Please share this information with your child so that they are aware of which bus to take at the end of the school day. We encourage students (who are eligible) to take the bus home on their first day to establish routines with the rest of their classmates.

Please note, you **do not** have to register for the bus if they are eligible. The only time you need to notify the school is if your child's before and after school arrangements

have changed from last year. If your child will be picked up from a different address or will be dropped off at a different address other than the home address (i.e. daycare within the boundaries of the school), please notify the school.

The school will be providing bus tags to grade one and two students only:

Grade one students: The school will provide bus tags to grade one students.

- Parents of grade one students are asked to confirm that the after school bus
 number and bus stop location on the bus tag provided to students on the first
 day of school (at the beginning of the day) is correct.
- If not, please go to the office before you leave the school grounds on Wednesday September 7th to clarify.

Grade two students:

Parents of grade two students should share with their child the after school
bus number and bus stop location on Wednesday morning so that they can
confirm that the information on their bus tag (provided to them by their
classroom teacher) is correct.

Online Start-Up Forms:

- The Board will be emailing families a link to a Google Form to complete the start-up forms (the week of Sept 12)
- Translations will be available
- Student GAPPS login information will be required for families to complete the forms.

Please ensure your students have their GAPPs login information at the start of the school year. If your child is *new* to the Board, the classroom teacher will provide your child with the GAPPs login information.

The form will include: • The Start-Up Permission Form (mandatory) • Student Information Consent Form (mandatory) • Request for Faith Accommodations Form • School Council Nomination Form

Office Index Card:

The office will be sending home an *Office Index Card* with your child's personal information. Please review the information, sign, date and return the form to your child's teacher. Please indicate on the form if there are any changes to guardian phone numbers, address, email addresses and emergency contact information.



At school:

- ★ If you choose to have your child wear a mask, provide your child with multiple snug and comfortable masks, so that masks can be changed as needed throughout the day;
- ★ Pack a reusable water bottle to be refilled at our filling station and a Boomerang lunch (all leftovers and packaging will go home with your child);
- ★ Send a change of clothing in a clear, labelled bag with their name to remain at school.

At home:

- ★ Set a bedtime routine to ensure that your child has a good rest each evening.
- ★ Involve your child in packing lunches. Participation in this routine may encourage your child to eat all snacks and lunches at school.
