Jason's Comments from the Quest Conference

Technologies in Learning

This workshop gave an insightful look into how commercially available computer games like Nintendo Wii and DSi was being used to enhance learning including literacy, numeracy, language, science and other key areas of the curriculum and to develop social interaction with children in Scottish Schools. Scotland currently leads the world in the use of game consoles in school. Case Studies was presented of schools Scotland using games for individual and group learning like:

- Dr. Kawashima's Brain Training DS
- Big Brain Academy DS
- Scrabble DS
- Nintendogs DS
- Sony Eye Pet
- Guitar Hero.
- Professor Layton DS
- Hotel Dusk: Room 214. DS
- 100 Classic Books Collection DS

There was also a focus on how to get children from 3-18 years to design their own computer games/robotics in order to help young people become creators and not just consumers of content using very cool websites:

- Scratch developed by MIT which can also be used with Lego Robotics : http://scratch.mit.edu/
- Sandbox
- Kodu by Microsoft: http://www.planetkodu.com/

A key component to this program was educating teachers about the games with a focus on:

- Inappropriate games e.g. Violence, Bullying, etc.
- Culture
- Professional development
- Platform limitations
- Motivation
- Training

The costs of the games for DSi and Nintendo Wii is not prohibitive today if bought online. Some Scottish Schools lend the Games out of the Library for group and individual learning in the class or to take home to do projects. Eg. Professor Layton, where students have to develop a presentation on a story presented in the game.
