# Administrators Report ~ N. Bonomo and R. Hamou

#### **EQAO**

A review of the school's continued response and action towards addressing the decline in math EQAO scores was presented. A combination of factors contribute to math success including: teaching practice; learning styles; partnerships with parents; student disposition; and providing students with authentic, relevant and meaningful activities. The staff have spent time focused on the issue, aligning their individual development plans with school needs, and analyzing EQAO responses in order to uncover patterns of where students struggled and where they were successful. Observations include:

- Grade 3 students had difficulty answering multi-step questions as well, they were challenged by answering multiple choice questions. Questions that included a visual/diagram were notably helpful to students in understanding the question being asked and how to solve it.
- Grade 6 students also had difficulty in answering multi-step questions amd demonstrated difficulty in understanding concepts behind the calculations. They also performed better when a visual accompanied the question.

So far, teachers are addressing these gaps through:

- providing students with multi-step problems and teaching students to analyze the question being asked;
- using manipulatives;
- training students to draw out and visualize the problem in order to fully understand the context of the question; and
- guided math groups to encourage dialogue and group problem-solving.

#### School Climate Survey

A summary of the results of last year's school climate survey was shared and discussed. In general, students feel welcome and safe at Windham Ridge. There are some instances of verbal bullying around appearance, marks, faith. Some students feel financially marginalized. This information will help the school to be mindful of these concerns and ensure barriers are removed for these students.
