### Land Acknowledgment

The new Land Acknowledgement for this year was read to the Council. It is provided here for reference and for those who would like to read the revised version:

"We affirm that we are all treaty people and acknowledge that the York Region District School Board is located on the lands of two treaties. These treaties have been signed with the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation and the First Nations of the Williams Treaties who are: the Mississaugas of Alderville, Curve Lake, Hiawatha, Scugog Island; and the Chippewas of Beausoleil, Rama, and Georgina Island who is our closest neighbour and partner in education.

To honour this agreement we will take up our responsibility to be respectful of their traditions, knowledge and inherent rights as sovereign nations. We will respect their relationship with these lands and recognize that our connection to this land is through the continued relationship with these First Nations, and we acknowledge our shared responsibility to respect and care for the land and waters for future generations."

### Update

Welcome to Mme Arcimartello our new Vice-Principal.

Welcome back to Sandy Fiorido who will now take on the role of Administrative Assistant, and welcome to Mme Khan as our new office assistant.

School had a very busy September. Many initiatives started.

- VORC came to visit for the Grade 2 and Grade 4 students
- Intermediate Student Leadership club formed with 102 students interested. Teachers may look at splitting students into different groups to take on different initiatives since interest is high. One team has started with morning announcements already.
- Cross country started for Grades 4-8
- Volleyball also has begun
- Terry Fox run took place on September 29, our school raised about \$1516!
- School also recognized Orange Shirt Day on September 30, our first day of Truth & Reconciliation

Air conditioning was installed in library, gymnasium, and the office. Construction is finished and library will hopefully reopen soon to students.

Recess cohorts are larger this year. Although split by floor where the first floor classrooms eat first, then go outside and the second floor classrooms go outside first, then eat after – some grades have been arranged so that they can go outside together regardless of the floor. For example, grade 8s go outside at the same time even though one class is on the second floor.

We had one COVID case where one grade 6 class had to stay home and isolate.

It will go towards the Edible Garden project as we seek to relocate the garden in a more suitable location in the yard. Grade 3 teachers will once again incorporate the garden in the science curriculum.

#### School Photos

R. Hamou has booked the dates for individual student photos as well as grade 8 grad photos with the company that did our grade 8 grad photos from last year. Waiting for the go ahead from the school board.

### Teacher Appreciation

Last year, our annual teacher appreciation event did not take place due to health restrictions. In lieu of this, council decided to plant a tree as a gift of appreciation. Location for this tree still needs to be determined. It was hoped that the tree could be planted near the outdoor classroom to provide some shade in the future but we are informed that the soil around that area may not be good to sustain the tree. Will need to speak to some experts to get more information.

### School pick-up and drop off traffic concerns

It was brought to our attention that there continues to be concern about the safety and flow of the traffic during pick-up and drop-off times along the street and in the kiss and ride loop. Some cars continue to disregard the rules when driving and ignore the safety of the children who are walking. It was questioned why we do not have a crossing guard at any of our intersections in and around the school. T. Dimopoulos and P. Kirouac to do a bit of research on the possibility of a crossing guard. Is this something with the

Town of Richmond Hill, or the school board, and is a petition needed to present our case. The traffic is a continued COVID challenge due to the increased number of parents choosing to drive their children instead of taking the school bus.
