# Administrators Report ~ N. Bonomo and R. Hamou

The Council's student representatives were welcomed and the importance of their voices on Council was reiterated.

#### **BIPSA/SIPSA**

#### First Nations Metis and Inuit (FNMI) Awareness

- FNMI awareness and education is an emerging and important issue for the board and school community within the context of social justice, truth and reconciliation.
- S. Dahesh has provided leadership and education to school staff. S. Dahesh facilitated a Life Cycle Wheel learning activity with Council to educate on Truth and Reconciliation.
- The council was in agreement that in order to contribute to Truth and Reconciliation, FNMI education and awareness should be integrated within the entire school community (i.e.students, teachers and parents). However, care must be taken to ensure the learning is meaningful, transformational and appropriate for each audience.

#### Action: A Land Acknowledgement will be read at the beginning of each Council meeting.

#### Challenge of Practice and Theories of Action

Staff team is currently putting focus into creating and facilitating deep, authentic and meaningful learning tasks for our students in order to increase student motivation and to deepen understanding, allowing for the transfer of knowledge into other contexts.

#### **Enrollment and Staffing**

On Sept 25, some of our primary classes were reorganized to meet ministry compliance. Specifically, our two 2-3 splits were dismantled and we now have five grade 2 and three grade 3 classes. There were no changes to the junior and intermediate classes.

#### EQAO update

As indicated in our last meeting, there is concern with the drop in math achievement for both grade 3 and 6 classes when compared to last year's results. Staff are being released to analyze the results along with report card data to identify where the gaps and challenges are. During the Oct 20<sup>th</sup> pd day, staff will discuss findings and next steps to bring scores back up.

# Action: A math lead will be invited to a future Council meeting to share finding and strategies.
