Administrators Report - V. Leone, S. Singh-Itwarie

- First day soft entry for grades 2-8– staff were inside to meet students upon entry to school.
- 26 homeroom classes with 540 students
 - We started with 26 homeroom classes and some primary class numbers were too high, so the school was given an additional staff.
 - System changes could not support hiring of grade 2/3 teacher. Currently:
 - 2 grade two classes at 23 students
 - 1 grade 3 class at 23
 - Started with a 7/8 split and two grade 8 classes
 - Has been changed to two grade 8 classes of 30 students (not over compliance)

Outdoor Spaces

- The new tarmac to be painted in the coming weeks.
- Track, pickleball courts, four square, hopscotch.
- The Board covers \$5000 for tarmac painting when there is new tarmac.
- Shading in the yard
 - o Shade umbrellas no longer permitted, awnings not permitted
 - Putting umbrellas on the tarmac would interfere with the snow plan and would interfere if portables were needed in the future.
 - o In lieu of the umbrellas, a grove of trees will be placed near the outdoor classroom which will provide shading in the coming years
 - Possible grants to cover the cost of the shading through partnership with Marina Dimitriadis at Board level

Grade 8 – Cedar Glen- Outdoor Education Centre.

- Grade 8 students to Cedar Glen in October
 - o Purpose is to build collaboration, social skills, community etc to support the year ahead
 - Depart from WRPS on October 30th 8:45 a.m. return on October 31st at approximately 6:00 p.m.
 - o Cost-\$206
 - Angel fund shared with families to support if required.
- Grade 8 graduation trip in June- has not been confirmed
- Grade 7 students will not go to Cedar Glen this year
