Barburrito was loaded onto school cash without a price increase, may be difficult to explain the increase if we run it again. Zucca's hot lunch program will begin February 9-March 8, 2024. Zucca's will be posted for \$5.50 a meal and will be delivered on Fridays. Jaclyn and Jill will work with the office to get the information onto school cash online for ordering. Poinsettia Fundraiser- is up and running on school cash online and will be available for the Holiday season. Christmas Families Fundraiser led by Krystine Ross was discussed, she is hoping to add more people to the group to be able to help more families. Farm to table-fundraiser is complete. Ms. Anderson needs volunteers for pick up night, November 28, 2023. Val Vriesen and Lyndsey McGill offered to help.

- Red and White Dance a ton planning is in full swing! Ms. Allen asked the student voice committee how they would like the dance a thon to run.
- Katrine reached out to the previous school council and was advised to use professor Jamz. They create everything, (posters, pledge forms, website for school) and provide lights and a DJ, the quote received was \$950.00 -\$2000.00 max based on 20% of funds received. Prof. Jamz was secured for February 13, 2024.
- Students will have opportunities to enter a draw for a basket and a chance to win larger prizes. 1 ticket for \$5.00 raised and 1 golden ticket for every \$20.00 raised. An equity piece would be to distribute 10 free tickets per class that can be awarded for good behavior/ kindness etc.
