Dear Parents/Guardians:

Once this page is complete, please return it to school so it can be filed in your child's Ontario Student Record. Students should co-reflect with you and set goals for their learning, behaviour and work habits for the coming term.

If you are interested in a deeper dialogue about this report card, you may want to consider scheduling a telephone interview with your child's teacher. If you wish to have an interview in person, please call the school and speak with your child's teacher to schedule an appropriate time. It is important to share any questions you have as the new term begins. Collaborating with all the teachers with whom your child works is an important factor in student success. Students can accomplish more when all stakeholders collaborate, share best practices and have ongoing communication about assignments and work habits.

Thank you to the families of our primary division who attended the winter concert, "On With The Snow". It was a fun-filled evening and we are very proud of our students' performance abilities. Tobogganing and Sledding Safety

Tobogganing and sledding are fun, popular winter activities; however, every year hundreds of children are injured on toboggans. Here are some tips to keep your children safe:

- Parents should always actively supervise children at the toboggan/sled hill
- Dress children in warm layers of brightly coloured, waterproof clothes and boots. Use a neck warmer instead of a scarf and cover children's heads, ears and hands
- Teach children to toboggan/sled down the middle of hill and use the sides to walk to the top
- To prevent head injuries, children should always wear a hockey or ski helmet designed to protect the head in all directions in icy conditions
- Toboggans/sleds should be sturdy, easy to control and in good condition
- Remind children to sit on a toboggan/sled face forward and not lay on their stomachs; never allow children to sled head first
- Choose a hill with a gentle slope and enough room to stop. The hill should be free of hazards (such as trees and rocks) and be well lit to see any potential dangers as well as to be seen by others
- Remind children to never jump in front of toboggans/sleds going downhill
- Make sure only the recommended number of children ride the toboggan/sled

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Regular School Attendance

Regular attendance is crucial for continued academic progress. Getting to class on time and avoiding absences are critical if your child is to get the most out of school. Attending school - every day and on time - is very important. Learning occurs daily, right from the start of class.

In order to be less disruptive to both staff and students during instructional time, please follow the following procedures:

- If your child is going to be late or absent from school, please report the absence <u>before</u> the start of the school day (8:55a.m.). Parents are required to call into the *SchoolConnects* automated notification system, by dialing the toll free number 1-855-203-2994 or go online at yorkrdsb.schoolconnects.com to report your child's absence.
- If you must sign out your child from school due to a scheduled appointment, please place a note in your child's agenda/communication bag so that your child's teacher will have time to prepare your child for an early dismissal (i.e. homework, notes). Children will be called down to the office when you arrive. Please avoid appointments during class time.
- If you need to pick up your child at the end of the school day (instead of taking the bus), tell your child <u>before</u> school and leave a note in their communication bag/agenda to inform the teacher of the change. Please make all attempts NOT to make last minute changes to your child's regular dismissal routine.

Healthy friendships and relationships

Healthy friendships and relationships:

- Make challenging times more manageable for your child
- Increase your child's resiliency
- Promote your child's social skill development as well as teaches him or her how to positively relate to others
- Builds your child's confidence, self-esteem and sense of belonging

How can parents help children develop healthy relationships?

- Model healthy relationships at home
- Encourage your child to participate in group activities and hobbies
- Provide opportunities for social interactions outside of school
- Encourage diversity by inviting your child to get to know children from different backgrounds
- Be open and non-judgmental when talking to your child about friendships

Having a positive social support system is important in maintaining positive mental health, which contributes to overall wellbeing.
