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

The School Council Minutes from November 7, 2024 were reviewed and adopted;

Student Council Report

Shrey and Sean reported on a number of exciting and engaging activities the Student Council run in November:

- SAC just finished off the month of November with the Fall Market in collaboration with a number of clubs
- The students are currently working on preparation for the Talent Show, Spirit Week and Winterfest
- 3. Eco Club has been collecting CDs and milk bags, which is a great way to spread awareness about how to garbage disposal; further, Eco Club will be holding a thrifting event on Dec 11, 2024
- 4. YLC Club is currently running their annual food drive; donations are being collected

- 5. Staff and Students are building a brand new club WC Alliance of Asia. The first meeting was held last week. The objective is to empower students!
- 6. Students have attended a Model UN conference at Maple High School on November 30th. They are holding bi-weekly practice runs to develop transferable skills such as problem solving, debating, also having fun to learn new things;
- 7. DECA 8 WC students competed at regionals. That happened at North Park Secondary School to exercise their business skills. We have students who are moving on to provincials!
- 8. Our Women's Advocacy Coalition recently hosted a bracelet making workshop for preparing for the fundraiser bake sale this Friday.

- 9. BSAA (Black Student Alliance Association) is hosting a Afro-Caribbean culture cookout in February
- 10. Prom committee has recently started up. This committee is returning to Woodbridge College brainstorming and fundraising efforts. They are outreaching for student input.
- 11. Finally, our Hack Club has just recently begun and is open to all students, regardless of programing or coding experience. Hack Club has just recently hosted a workshop to teach students how to make their very first website.

Teachers Report

- 1. Seneca College Presentation on December 10th for students who are not permanent residents and are applying to post secondary colleges and universities (during lunch)
- 2. Registration for Semester 2 Dual Credit is underway, applications are still being accepted. Students should see Ms. Bazzo in room 218.
- 3. 47 Grade 11 and 12 students have recently acquired their Standard First Aid through the SHSM program.
- 4. WC is among the top three schools in the Board in SHSM student certifications and paperwork completion.
- 5. Accelerated OYAP typically occurs in the Spring months of semester 2; a pilot program was developed to begin student learning in January. WC is sending one of only two students in the YRDSB to this pilot program for studies in Electrical Construction and Maintenance.

Administrators' Report

- 1. OSSLT went well. Our students have written, and we will receive results towards the end of the semester to support second semester programming.
- 2. Student Success Awards and Honour Role Breakfast on November 26th was a great success. More families in attendance than in past years. It was great to see the community coming together to celebrate success of the students and families.
- 3. Grade 8 Night on November 28th welcomed many gr. 8 students and families to the school. We had many attendees from out of the Board, and we received wonderful feedback from our guests. It was a wonderful event!
- 4. Grade 8 Visits to WC's Feeder Schools will take place between January 13th and 21st. We are also making a special trip to Elder's Mills P.S. and Blue Willow, who requested that we come speak with their school about WC and what WC has to offer/course selection/transitioning into grade 9.

- 5. Course Selection Evening will take place on Thursday, February 13, 2025. Families from grade 8 11 will be invited to attend on a drop-in basis to be supported with the process and have opportunity to get personalized support and questions answered.
- 6. Graduation Photos occur the week of Dec. 9 13; Student will need to book appointments through Edge Imaging website
- 7. Welcome Tyler Tillmann from our English Department. Mr. Tillmann transferred at the beginning of the semester to WC. He has recently completed his Master Degree with thesis on parent engagement in school improvement planning; Mr. Tillmann spoke about School Improvement Plan and parents' input into its discussion and development.

School council Report

- 1. There is a high need to engage more parents into the School Council. So that we can run different programs, initiatives and more dialog with the parents, reach out to them. and we also met with the school to get the conversations going. One of the suggestions is to send a broadcast email to all the parents as a school council so that we can start engaging with them directly.
- 2. secondly, we will start on drafting application for the school council grant. We wanted to do this last year, but we were too late.
- 3. Another initiative, we want to do a fundraising for the graduation and other students' needs. A few suggestions were discussed, such as Krispy Kreme, popcorn, cookies, book drive, etc.






Woodbridge College Regular Track Boundary


