School Cash Online

All YRDSB schools are now using School Cash Online as an online payment system. We ask families to please refrain from sending in food as treats for birthdays, celebrations, etc.

There are a number of students at Yorkhill with life-threatening allergies. As a staff we take serious precautions to avoid any unnecessary risks. We look at the sharing of food as one of these risks. We ask your cooperation in helping to keep our students safe by not sending food to school with your child to share with others or to celebrate a birthday.

If you feel the need to share something for your child's birthday, please find an alternative (pencils, stickers, etc.), that students can hand out.

Another very creative way that families can celebrate a birthday is to purchase a book for the class, wrap it up, and let your child open it in front of everyone and have the teacher read it (with a personalized birthday message from you!). There are lots of alternatives.....these are just a few.
