SIGN IN/OUT PROCEDURES

As an added precaution in monitoring our attendance and being accountable for the safety of our students, we have sign-in and sign-out procedures for Yorkhill Elementary School students. When students arrive late for any reason, they must check in at the office for an admission and late slip. Students leaving for appointments, illnesses, or any other reason must be signed out by a parent in our sign-out binder.

To make our school safe, we also require that any parents visiting the school, or volunteering with a class, <u>must si</u> <u>an in when they arrive and sign out when they leave in the visitors' portion of the binder at the front office</u> <u>counter</u>. Visitor ID badges are to be obtained at the office and <u>must be worn</u>, during your entire visit, for safety reasons. Thank you for your co-operation.

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BOOK OF FORMS

A number of important forms have been included in the package sent home on the first day of school. Some we require you to fill out, sign and return to school. Please read them carefully and return them to your child's home- room teacher. An emergency contact information sheet will be sent home by the end of the month. Please review and send back to school by Friday, September 30th. Thank you in advance for your prompt attention to this request.

SAFE ARRIVAL PROGRAM

Through a directive from the Ministry of Education and Training, all School Boards are to implement a safe arrival program in their schools. The York Region District School Board has been working very closely with the York Regional Police to ensure the safety of our students. For instance, the safe arrival program at Yorkhill ES. depends on parents to notify the office in the event of their child's late arrival or absence. All parents and guardians are reminded to please call the school (905) 764-5292 if their child is going to be absent or late. School starts promptly at 8:50 a.m. You may leave a message on the answering machine if calling before 8:00 a.m. or after 4:00 p.m. Please leave your child's name, teacher's name and the reason for the absence. If calling is not possible, please inform the school in person or send a note or email to the office. Please make sure you inform the office of any absences or lates.

If a student is not in school and the school office has not received notification from the parents, the school will take the following steps: Step 1 Call the student's home. If there is no answer the school will, Step 2 Call the parents at work and cell phone If there is no response the school will, Step 3 Call the emergency contact person. If the contact person cannot be reached then, Step 4



The school will notify the York Regional Police that the student is missing.

Please remember to call the school if your child will be late or absent.

You may be interested to know that the secretary often spends over 60 minutes daily following up on numerous unreported absences. Each year we are forced to contact York Regional Police to assist in finding a 'missing child'. All too often, the child is found with his/her parent. Please help out by being conscientious about phoning the school when your child is going to be absent or late.

FREEDOM OF INFORMATION

The York Region District School board recognizes and highlights the significant achievements of our students through a variety of sources: front hall displays, school and board publications, and in the media, school web site, special fundraising events (that attract media attention), recordings and displays for events such as graduations and seasonal celebrations. We believe this recognition is essential to enhance our students' self esteem and to foster a positive school environment. To enable us to be in accordance with the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act we request that those parents who do NOT want their child's accomplishments recognized, work displayed or photo-

graphs taken for this purpose, please notify the School Administration inwriting.

MEDICATION REQUIRED

The safety of our students is paramount. Please let the office know of any medical conditions or allergies that affect your child by filling it in on the Emergency Form (These forms were sent home already and extra copies can be picked up in the school office). It is a good idea to mention any significant health issues to your child's homeroom teacher.

Children who need to take medication at school require a *Request for Administration of Oral Medication Form* signed by the parent before the medication can be given. If your child requires medication during the school day please speak to the secretaries Mrs. Cortes and Ms. Wright

TERRY FOX RUN-September 29th

Yorkhill Elementary School is a caring community and has much to offer the Terry Fox foundation. This is a great cause in fighting a disease that is suffered by Canadians and others alike.

Did you know that during Terry Fox's run across Canada. He ran an average of 42 km/day. He ran for 143 days and through 6 provinces, totalling 5373 kilometres before he was forced to quit in Thunder Bay. After receiving treatment for the cancer that had spread to his lungs, Terry passed away one month shy of his 23rd birthday.

SAFETY WEEK

To support our Board's commitment to providing safe learning environments for all students, **Fri- day**, **September 26 - Friday**, **September 30**, **2016** has been designated as "YRDSB Safety Week." All public elementary and secondary schools across the region will be featuring activities and events that highlight various facets of safety at school and in the community. Students will be participating in a wide variety of activities intended to increase awareness of safety hazards and how to avoid them.

In addition, as part of our safety week activities, all schools in the York Region District School Board will be conducting emergency preparedness exercises. To ensure that all members of the school community are familiar with the emergency procedures, we will be conducting practices. In advance of the drill, we will review protocols and expectations during an emergency with all affect- ed partners.

A Hold and Secure and Lock Down response would typically be called in the event of an <u>intruder</u> entering the school, a <u>fatality</u> or a <u>violent storm</u>. The procedure calls for all students to be se- cured in a locked classroom, gym or other secure area, and to situate themselves on the floor and away from doors and windows.

Please join with us in helping to ensure that student safety is a top priority during Safety Week and throughout the year. If you have any questions about student safety, please contact the school at any time.

Fight the bite! Protect yourself against West Nile virus



What is West Nile virus?

West Nile virus is a mosquito-borne virus that can be passed to humans through the bite of an infected mosquito.

What are the symptoms of West Nile virus?

Most people infected with West Nile virus have no symptoms or have flu-like symptoms such as fever, headache, body aches and fatigue. Sometimes West Nile virus can cause severe illness including meningitis and encephalitis (inflammation of the brain).

Symptoms usually develop between two and 15 days after being bitten by an infected mosquito.

Fight the bite!

What you can do…

Clean up

The best way to keep mosquitoes away is to clean up areas of standing water where mosquitoes like to breed.

Here are some tips:

- Clean up and empty containers where water collects (old tires, tin cans, flower pots, etc.)
- Change water in bird baths weekly
- Remove water that collects on pool covers
- Turn over items such as wading pools, wheelbarrows and small boats
- Clear eavestroughs and roof gutters
- Unclog drainage ditches
- Drill holes in the bottoms of containers so water can't collect
- Check that door and window screens are tight-fitting and in good repair

Cover up

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Protect yourself and your family from mosquito bites.

- Wear light-coloured, long- sleeved shirts and pants
- Use insect repellent containing DEET when outdoors; apply according to manufacturer's instructions
