At our PA DAY on October 27th, staff were engaged in reflecting on the current context at Yorkhill, including student learning needs. We are now beginning to update our School Improvement Plan, which involves analyzing assessment data such as EQAO. As a staff, we will continue to focus on the areas of assessment and critical thinking while creating an equitable and inclusive learning environment where all students learn through inquiry and collaboration. We will continue to build students' ability to work collaboratively by developing their use of the learning skills and work habits which lead to academic achievement.

We continue to work collaboratively with our School Council to support the goals of our School Improvement Plan. The School Council has been busy with organizing pizza lunches, sub lunches, movie nights, a family dance, as well as with looking at ways to fundraise for the school and get more parents and guardians involved. Cold Weather Reminder



As the cooler weather approaches, we ask that you ensure your child comes to school dressed appropriately. All students are expected to go outside during morning and lunch recesses.

When severe weather condi-

tions threaten the safety of our students, the School Board informs radio stations about bus cancellations by about 6:45 a.m.

Buses cancelled in the morning will <u>not</u> be running in the afternoon. Parents who drive their children to school in the morning <u>must</u> also pick them up at 3:10 p.m. On days when school buses have been cancelled, it is up to the parents' discretion whether or not to send their children to school. Cancellation of bus service does not mean that schools are closed.



From September 30 - October 3, we hosted our first Scholastic book fair of the year. Students, families and staff enjoyed browsing new titles, and purchased many great books to enhance personal and classroom collections. The book fair gives the school the opportunity to bring a lot of new books into the library and into your child's classroom. The book fair was so successful that we are now able to add \$2400 worth of new materials to our library collection! Thanks go out to our student library assistants and volunteers for helping out during the book fair, and to our school community for supporting Yorkhill's library and literacy program!



School Bus Cancellations

To ensure the safety of students, school bus service may be cancelled from time to time due to inclement weather, extreme temperatures and/or poor road conditions. In these cases, parents and students should develop alternate care/transportation arrangements.

Since some bus schedules begin by 7:00 a.m., cancellation decisions must be made by 6:00 a.m. to allow time to communicate this message to bus drivers. Cancellation decisions will only be made after thorough consultation with the Safety Officers of school bus companies servicing York Region and are based on several factors including precipitation, air temperature, road conditions and weather forecast.

Please note the following;

• A decision to cancel school bus service will be **region-wide** meaning all school buses, vans and taxis will not operate.

• School bus routes may be cancelled when severe weather may not be affecting all municipalities in York Region. Both the YRDSB and YCDSB operate many regional educational programs. Students attending these programs are transported over large attendance areas encompassing several municipal boundaries. This limits the ability to cancel bus service using a municipality or zone methodology.

Unless otherwise stated, schools will remain open and parents can make arrangements to transport their children to and from school even if school bus service is cancelled. If buses are cancelled in the morning, they will not operate in the afternoon. Therefore students transported to school by parents will require the same transportation home.

Even if your child's class is not participating in this challenge, you can still help to minimize waste by following these tips below:

Waste Free Lunch Tips

- Get children to help pack their lunches with healthy foods
- Only pack as much food as your child will eat
- Use a reusable lunch bag/box for carrying a lunch
- Use a refillable bottle for drinks
- If you choose to use a single serving container, please make sure it is recyclable

• Put sandwiches, muffins, etc. in reusable containers, instead of in plastic bags. Label them with your child's name so they have a better chance of coming home

- Avoid pre-packaged, single-serve portions of snacks
- Put re-usable napkins in your child's lunch box

• Prepare extra food at dinnertime and use leftovers for lunches. Minimize the morning rush by packing lunches the night before and refrigerating overnight



What Exactly is A Touchstone?

Character development has always been an important part of the Yorkhill program. We have had a long association with such initiatives as Character Matters and Future Aces. These have laid the foundation for the next generation of Character education at Yorkhill: The Yorkhill Touchstone.

Developing a common language of character and identifying the values and goals of a school community solidifies a school's character initiative. When everyone -- students, staff and parents -- use the same words to describe behaviours and expectations, talking about how we interact becomes easier. A TOUCHSTONE is a document which outlines these values, goals and behaviours. Developed by a team of student writers, based on data collected from our parent community through the School Council, our staff, and the students themselves, the TOUCHSTONE effectively gives voice to the core values of a community.

Schools that have developed TOUCHSTONES find restorative conversations more productive, given the document itself is community-created; everyone starts on the same page.

The ideas contained in the TOUCHSTONE are expressed in verbs (noticeable actions) rather than nouns (often vague concepts, needing further explanations). When a school works together to create a TOUCHSTONE, its core values are identified and celebrated. Think of it as a mission statement expressing the beliefs of a particular community—in this case, our school.

To promote and celebrate our Touchstone, Yorkhill students and staff will participate in monthly Touchstone Assemblies; parents and guardians are welcome. These assemblies will replace the traditional Future Aces assemblies, which have prepared us for this next step in character development at Yorkhill ES. Please join us when you can.
