
Our schools are stronger when families are engaged. There are many different ways families can support their child's learning and get involved in life at the school, and I hope that you find opportunities to get engaged.

PICK UP AND DROP OFF ROUTINES

We ask all parents to support us in ensuring the

safe arrival and departure of all our children. We encourage all students who qualify for bussing to use bussing in order to eliminate unnecessary congestion and traffic around the school. We would like to point out that the loop at the front of the school is a fire route. Only busses and those requiring wheel chair access parking spots have priority to enter the school. For the safety of all our students, if you are driving your child to school, please park on a side street and walk your child to school. Please do not park and leave your car in the loop as it will block others from using this service. For parents picking up walkers, please come to the back of the school to the designated pick up area by the primary doors.

We appreciate your support as we establish our safety routines at our school. Also, if you plan to pick up your child early from school, <u>you must send your child's teacher a note and</u> <u>come to the office to sign out your child as well</u>. If you call the office, we may not get this message until much later so a note to the teacher is preferable.

As we start the 2018-2019 school year, we would like to remind and encourage families to consider **walking or cycling with children to and from school**. There are many benefits to walking and cycling to school. It:

- Improves student academic performance by making children more alert and better prepared to learn.
- Contributes to the daily goal of 60 minutes of moderate or vigorous activity for children, improving their health and overall fitness.

Reduces traffic congestion and improves safety for everyone in school zones.

Promotes life-long habits that foster independence and active lifestyles, preparing children for their future.

For those who can't walk or cycle to school every day, choosing active travel once, twice or a few days a week can still provide benefits. You can also consider parking a block away from the school and walking the rest of the way. Include active travel as part of your daily routine!





PERSONAL PROPERTY & ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Students who bring valuable personal property to school do so at their own risk. The school has no storage facilities for valuable items and we cannot take care of these items for students. The School Board or school will not assume any responsibility for lost or stolen items. We ask that all valuable items are left at home.

Electronic Devices such as cell phones, smart phones and other personal communication devices are **NOT** permitted to be used in the school building at any time during the instructional day except with the clear permission of the classroom teacher. The school is not responsible for personal items that go missing at the school. Any student using an electronic device that connects to the YRDSB's wireless network must follow Board Policy #194.0 - Appropriate Use of Technology. Please complete the Information Technology Agreement and return it to the school.

For emergency or urgent situations, students may use the phone in the office or calls can be made with direct teacher supervision from each classroom. Students should not be texting each other or parents during school hours. Students are not allowed to bring, nor are they permitted to use, cameras, cell phone cameras, camcorders or any other type of audio or video recording devices on school property at any time unless they have been given direct permission from the school staff to use such a device for instructional purposes.

PAID LUNCH TIME PROGRAMS

Parents have the option to sign their child up for different paid lunch time programs such as Art, and Mad Science. Please note that these programs are on a first come first serve basis and fill up very quickly. Be on the look out for the registration packages coming home soon.

The York Region District School Board is committed to providing safe learning environments for all students. During the year, we will have several practice fire evacuation drills and lock down drills. To further support this endeavour, the week of September 24 to September 28 has been designated YRDSB Safety Awareness Week. All public elementary and secondary schools across the region will be featuring activities and events that highlight various facets of safety at school and in the community. As part of the Safety Awareness Week activities, all schools in the York Region District School Board will be conducting emergency preparedness exercises. To ensure that all members of the school community are familiar with the emergency procedure, we will be conducting practice drills. In advance of the drill, we will review protocols and expectations during an emergency with all students, staff and affected partners

LUNCHES AND ALLERGY AWARENESS

Nutrition is very important. Please help your children make good food choices for their lunches. We discourage sharing of lunches because of food allergies. We continue to need your cooperation in keeping **the school a nut-safe area**. As we have explained in the past, we are doing all we can to protect the lives of some of our students who have life threatening allergies to peanut and nut products. We need your help and vigilance in assisting us in providing a safe and healthy environment for all. In keeping with this policy, **please do not send food to school with your child to celebrate his or her birthday**. We will acknowledge birthdays by announcing them on the morning announcements.

FOOTWEAR AND CLOTHING

Please make sure your child has a pair of indoor shoes for school.

Outdoor shoes track in mud and dirt and it can be very uncomfortable for the children to wear wet shoes and socks all day. Every student **must** have a clean pair of running shoes, with nonmarking soles, for their physical education classes, which they can also wear as indoor shoes. Some primary teachers may also ask students to bring in a change of clothing in the event they need clean/dry clothes during the day..

Focusing on the Fundamentals of Math, Grades 1-8

The Ontario government recently released a <u>parent fact sheet</u> and a <u>teacher's guide</u> on *Focusing on the Fundamentals* of *Math in grades 1 to 8*. In the guide, teachers are asked to focus attention on expectations from the Number Sense and Patterning strands of the current math curriculum and are also asked to focus on student understanding and sense-making before formal methods, such as using traditional formulas, are introduced.

York Region teachers have always worked to develop strong number sense, computational fluency and automaticity with math facts while supporting student understanding of underlying concepts. All educators in our board continue to support students in becoming confident problem solvers who use mathematical knowledge, skills and processes to be contributing members of a changing society.

In order to support your child with math at home and in day-to-day life, the <u>math page on our board website</u> lists useful websites, activities and games that you can reference and use. Thank you for the important role you play in the creation of confident problem solvers.

Math is everywhere!

September is a great time to start building routines at home which can support children in developing a positive disposition towards math. Providing opportunities at home that promote math talk can support a child's mathematical knowledge and understanding. Whether you are, shopping, cooking, playing a game, organizing, taking a walk, or reading, there are many opportunities to highlight math in different ways.

Activities:

Primary - Grocery Shopping

Ask your child to estimate how many of a grocery item (for example, a type of fruit or vegetable, bread or pet food) your family will need for the week.

Ask, "Why do you think that amount will be needed?"

At the end of the week, have your child count the number actually used.

Junior/Intermediate - Budget Challenge



Give your child an imaginary budget to spend at his or her favourite store (flyers or

online catalogues may be helpful). Without writing down the amounts, have your child choose items to purchase. He or she will have to use estimation to stay within the budget. Then, have your child add up the actual costs. Did she or he stay within the budget? For a challenge, help your child estimate any taxes.

Tips for Math

Build strong, positive attitudes about math.

When children feel positively engaged and successful, they are more likely to stick with an activity or a problem to find a solution.

Begin with activities that meet your child's

level of mathematical understanding. Early success in solving problems will build your child's confidence. Gradually move to activities that provide more challenge for your child.

If you and your child are more comfortable

in a language other than English, use it. Your child will understand concepts better in the language that he or she knows best

<u>*For Security Reasons your password, requires 8</u> <u>characters,</u> <u>one uppercase</u> letter, <u>one lowercase</u> letter and a <u>number</u>.

Step 2: Confirmation Email

A registration confirmation email will be automatically forwarded to you. Click on the link provided inside the email to confirm

your email and School Cash Online account. The confirmation link will open the School Cash Online site prompting you to sign into your account. Use your email address and password just created with your account.

Step 3: Find Student

NOTE: A STUDENT NUMBER IS REQUIRED

This step will connect your children to your account.

- a) Enter the School Board Name
- b) Enter the School Name
- c) Enter Your Child's Student # and Last Name
- d) Select *Continu*e
- e) On the next page confirm that you are related to the child, check in the Agree box and select **Continue**
- f) Your child has been added to your account

Step 4: View Items or Add Another Student

If you have more children, select "Add Another Student" option and repeat the steps above. 5 children can be added to one parent account.

If you do not wish to add additional children, select "**View Items For Students"** option. A listing of available items for purchase will be displayed.
